

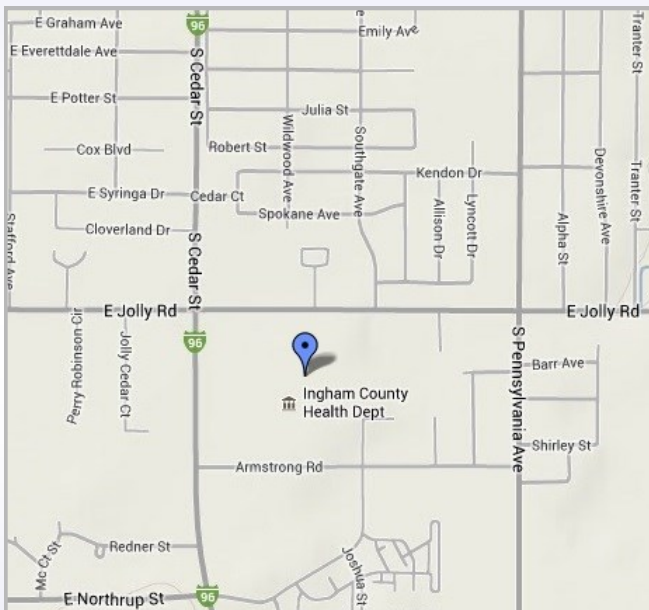
## DIRECTIONS

## OTHER INFORMATION

### Medications / Pharmaceutical Disposal Options

- Non-controlled medications are accepted during the HHW collection season
- Please visit the Capital Area Take Back Meds [website](http://www.takebackmeds.org) (http://www.takebackmeds.org) out of season for more non-controlled medicine disposal locations in Ingham County
- Controlled medicines are **NOT ACCEPTED**. Please visit the Capital Area Take Back Meds website (http://www.takebackmeds.org) for controlled medicine disposal locations
- Vitamins & minerals are **NOT ACCEPTED** & can be thrown in the trash
- **PLEASE** combine all pills and capsules in ziplock bags & discard bottle & blister packaging
- Liquids, ointments, creams & aerosols can be left in the original container but all personal information must be blacked out



### **ALL PERSONAL INFORMATION ON PACKAGING MUST BE BLACKED OUT**

#### Sharps

- Sharps **MUST** be disposed of in a rigid container with a tight / sealable lid
- Example containers include; red medical waste containers, coffee cans or plastic detergent bottles
- Sharps will **NOT** be accepted in bags, milk jugs, pop bottles, diaper wipe containers or glass jars

## ACCEPTED ITEMS

- Acids & Bases (pool chemicals, toilet bowl cleaners)
- Aerosol Products (throw empties in the trash)
- Automotive Products (brake, steering, transmission fluid) only.
- Cleaners & Polishes
- Flammables (gasoline: please be prepared to surrender you gas can)
- Fluorescent Lights (CFL & Tubes) & Ballasts (removed from fixture)
- Fuel Oil
- Home Repair Products (glue, caulk, etc.)
- Mercury\* Containing Devices (place thermometers & thermostats in a ziplock bag)
- Non-controlled Medications (prescription and over the counter)
- Oil Based Paints & Paint Products (inc. thinner, mineral spirits, stains) **WE DO NOT ACCEPT** latex paint
- Pesticides, Herbicides & Fungicides
- Photographic Chemicals
- Sharps (needles, lancets, epinephrine pens)
- Small Propane Tanks (1 Lb size)
- Wood Preservatives

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\*Mercury containing devices are accepted by appointment year round at the Environmental Health Department. Please call 517-887-4521 to arrange a drop off date / time.

## ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED

- Antifreeze
- Appliances
- Asbestos
- Asphalt
- Batteries
- Carbon Monoxide Detectors
- Cooking Oil
- Dry Wall Compound
- Electronics
- Empty Containers
- Explosives / Ammunition
- Latex Paint (see below)
- Product in 55 Gallon Drums
- Propane Tanks ( >1 Lb)
- Radioactive Material
- Smoke Detectors
- Waste Oil

### Proper Latex Paint Disposal

- Latex paint is **NOT ACCEPTED** at the HHW collection.
- It can be disposed via regular trash, once solidified.
- If the can is half full add cat litter, sand, saw dust or soil to absorb the paint and mix well.
- If you have a full can, combine the paint & cat litter, sand, saw dust or soil in a box lined with a trash bag.
