Fans Storm Meridian Recycling Event ☺

700 households and 80 volunteers braved the weather to support a Fall Recycling Day on October 3. In spite of the weather and busy "Homecoming" activities at three local high schools, more than 20 students volunteered as well! See pics at <http://bit.ly/merid-2015>. Items recycled, re-used, or safely disposed of included:

- **304 lbs of medicines** with help from Ingham County Health Dept, Meridian Police, and a local pharmacist.
- **500 egg cartons** were collected and will be re-used by Titus Farms
- **Packing Peanuts** (1.5 cu. yard will be reused by Bestway Pack-N-Send in Haslett)
- **11,580 lbs of metal** were collected and recycled by Friedland Industries
- **Freon** from 61 dehumidifiers, AC units, and refrigerators/freezers was recaptured/recycled by Friedland.
- **46 bicycles** will be fixed up and re-used by MSU Recycling and Share-A-Bike
- **5000 pounds of documents** were confidentially shredded.
- **A full truck of clothing, shoes, and household items** was collected with help from the Salvation Army and Kellie's Consignments. Most of the material will be resold to help support an Adult Rehabilitation Center.
- **18,590 lbs. of TVs and monitors** and **5,680 lbs. of mixed electronics** will be recycled.
- **2350 cans of paint** were collected with help from ePaint Recycling and will be remanufactured in to a high quality paint, available at Habitat ReStores in Lansing and Williamston.
