


Mark Your Calendars for October 1 Recycling Day

Energy-Saving Devices Work... *If you use them correctly*

A new study shows that people living in green dwellings who don't maximize their technology can lose half of the energy savings available to them. "Technological advances in building and equipment account for only 42% of energy consumption," said Dong Zhao, in MSU's School of Planning, Design and Construction. Meridian Recognized for Green Achievement!

Meridian Township has been awarded a Silver Medal for achievement as a Michigan Green Community. Statewide, nearly two dozen communities were awarded this honor. Meridian Township was recognized for helping to maintain a healthy environment through wetland protection, land preservation, greenspace protection, clean energy improvements, and a pathway initiative. This is the second time Meridian Township has been recognized for its achievements, once before in 2014.
